## Details of our speakers:



### **Mr John T Machin MA(Oxf) MBBS FRCS(Tr&Orth) PGC**

John is the Clinical Lead for Litigation at GIRFT, working with the GIRFT chair, Prof Tim Briggs at NHS England & Improvement to ensure patient care is improved from reviewing clinical negligence claims in collaboration with NHS Resolution.

John graduated with honours in Medical Sciences at Magdalen College, Oxford before completing his training at UCL. He became a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England and completed Higher Surgical Training in Nottingham. His current clinical role is as a post-CCT fellow in Trauma and Orthopaedics specialising in hip and knee surgery at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre in Oxford. He has recently completed an international fellowship at the Lower Limb Reconstruction & Oncology Unit, University of British Columbia, Vancouver, Canada.



### **Dr Pallavi Bradshaw MRCOphth, Deputy Chief Medical Officer, AXA Health**

Pallavi read medicine at the University of Cambridge and undertook higher surgical training in Ophthalmology. She has pursued further studies in law and business and worked in various strategic lead roles for the Medical Protection Society. She supported and advised healthcare professionals and organisations across the globe and was responsible for development and delivery of education and risk management training. She is a fellow of the faculty of forensic and legal medicine.

She is currently Deputy Chief Medical Officer, Medicolegal at AXA Health. She supports the business with subject matter expertise and engages with clinicians and organisations to promote an open and learning culture. She has a particular interest in human factors and clinician burnout. She has written and presented extensively on patient safety issues internationally and co-authored the 'Open Disclosure' chapter in *Oxford Professional Practice: Handbook of Patient Safety*, ed. ### **Dr Annie Hunningher MbChB, FRCA, Consultant in Anaesthesia, NatSSIPs2 Clinical Lead, Anaesthesia Thrombectomy Lead, Royal London Hospital, Barts Health**

Annie sits on the steering group as a clinical lead, for the RCOA/CPOC committee, for the National Safety Standards for Invasive Procedures (NatSSIPs) and is co-authoring NatSSIPs2. Annie is a regional lead for SALG, the RCOA Safety anaesthesia liaison group. Annie is an IHI QI coach and has recently completed the HSIB silver training. Annie was a UCLP improvement fellow 2017 and ran a UCLP invasive network for safety 2018-2020. In 2017,

she and the NatSSIPs team were awarded the Barts Health Hero award for Safety. Annie has developed and delivered educational courses including trust wide NatSSIPs MDT training, a national NatSSIPs implementation course, MATCH (Multidisciplinary action training in crises and human factors) and Gas Again (a return-to-work course for anaesthetists awarded the Humphry Davy Award Royal College of Anaesthetists 2017). Annie is a co-organiser of a number of safety conferences. Annie works clinically as a Consultant Anaesthetist at the Royal London and specialises in ENT, thrombectomy and emergencies.



**Professor Ashok Handa, FRCS, Associate Professor of Surgery and Consultant Vascular Surgeon Director, Collaborating Centre for Values-based Practice St Catherine's College, Oxford**

Ashok Handa is Associate Professor of Surgery at Oxford University and Honorary Consultant Vascular Surgeon at the John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford. He is the Director for Surgical Education and responsible for the undergraduate curriculum in surgery for Oxford University.

He is Director of the Collaborating Centre for values-based practice in Health and Social Care based at St Catherine's College, Oxford and responsible for leading on education and research for the centre. He is Fellow in Clinical Medicine and Tutor for Graduates at St Catherine's College, responsible for 450 graduates across all disciplines.

He has over 200 publications in vascular surgery, surgical education, patient safety and many on the topic of values-based practice, shared decision making and consent. He has been a member of the Advisory Board of CORESS for 7 years and the Council of the Medical Defence Union for 5 years.
